
Mozambique National Health System

Directed to 32 Mental Health Technicians (MHT) from the different regions and also to a few Psychologists, Psychiatrists and Neurologists who worked as local tutors.


Objectives

- At the end the students:
- to be able to work in a multidisciplinary team,
- to transmit their knowledge to other technicians, to help in the psychosocial integration of people with
- to improve their diagnosis and treatment capabilities.
- Identification of the Epileptic Syndromes present in the community Identification of the different epileptic seizures
- - More appropriate treatment for each situation.
- Therapeuthic indications for acute situations
 When to start treatment in a patient with the diagnosis of epilepsy. To discuss:
- their difficulties and limitations in the daily practice
- the best way to overcome them.

- Methodology
- Several means of training: - data show presentations with • video presentation of different seizures types and situations,
- Exercise consultations with real patients from the community,
- Case studies
- Group Work, in two to four groups,
- Plenary discussion of the results









Final Evaluation of the Course and of the Students

The final evaluation included :

- the progress of knowledge
- comparing the results of an initial 34 multiple choice questions test and a similar retest at the end,
- the participation of the students during the course
 capacity to answer questions
 - active collaboration in the prosecution of the course
- capacity to communicate with the colleagues and the patients.



Constitution of the Mozambique Chapter of the ILAE/IBE:

- At the end of the last day the Constitutive Assembly of the Mozambique Chapter of the ILAE /IBE took place.
 - Dr. Lídia Gouveia was elected as President
 - Dr. Palmira Santos as Secretary.

Most dramatic difficulties found

- Frequent rupture of already scarce stocks of drugs
- Complete lack of diagnostic means even EEG.
- Extreme need to educate the community on the disease and the possibilities of control.

Recomendations

- Continuous education of the health workers involved in the treatment of epilepsy
- Implementation of the Mozambique Chapter of the ILAE and the IBE as one only association including technicians and lay people.
- To repeat the course for the other MHT which had no opportunity to be present in this course.
- To implement regional meetings of the MHT and the Tutors
- To include the Regional Tutors in the future Health Department visits to the different regions
- To implement mechanisms to assure the existence of permanent stocks for the basic antiepileptic drugs namely Phenobarbital and rectal Diazepam.

The Faculty members and some of the local tutors had an interview at the end of the MHT Course where these difficulties and recommendations were exposed to the Ministry of Health of Mozambique who manifested an obvious interest in future
